Cross-Professions Collaboration Program in Health Education Scholarship (CPCHES)

As a health professions educator, you...

- Want to develop your education scholarship
- Want to advance research and/or practice in health professions education;
- See the value of working and learning within a cross-professional project team; and
- Want help to build those cross-professional connections.

CPCHES can...

Nurture the development of cross-professional learning and scholarship teams that

- Take up issues or questions of importance across the health professions;
- Include individuals from at least two health professions; and
- Are in their formative stages.

Who is it for?

The initiative is designed for individuals in any role in health professions education at UBC who want to apply a scholarly lens to considering an educational issue of importance across the health disciplines, and who would benefit from working within a collaborative, cross-professional team to advance their learning, leadership, scholarship, practice, or research.

You do not have to have an identified team in place to participate in this initiative! In fact, the goal is to help in linking you with others who share your interests and concerns.

How does CPCHES work?

The initiative is led by a leadership team with representation from across the health professions and is offered in partnership through the Centre for Health Education Scholarship, the Faculty of Education, and the College of Health Disciplines.

CPCHES works to cultivate the development of two types of cross-professional "project teams" in the formative stages: *Learning Teams* that enable scholars from across health professions to come together to advance their knowledge about a shared question or issue; and *Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Teams (SoTL)* that support scholars in early stages of shaping a collaborative research or SoTL project.

Depending on the proposed project, supports to teams might include: assistance in building the network, group facilitation of up to 7 meetings per year, support from a graduate academic or research assistant, and/or assistance in connecting with expertise/information that might advance the team's learning and project. The goal is to nurture the development of sustainable collaborations or networks that will continue to thrive beyond the program.

How can CPCHES help me?

CPCHES can help participants develop as scholars, educators, and leaders; network around common issues; expand their perspectives on health professions education; seize opportunities to lead and mentor; strengthen or clarify a program of research/learning; gain access to resources; and/or improve research grant competitiveness.
